TASK

IDEA

Some people think that prayer is about asking God for anything we want. Does God always answer these kind of prayers? Perhaps prayer is more than asking for things.

QUESTIONS

- Why might prayer be like going to a sweet shop? In what ways is it different?
- Have you ever prayed? What happened?

TASK

On your own, write down some of your ideas about prayer. Turn these ideas into a piece of art. It could be a picture, poem, painting or something else that you would like to create.

IDEA

We all have arguments from time to time with our friends and family. Even countries can have arguments with each other. Sometimes they lead to division, misunderstanding and violence.

QUESTIONS

- What ways can arguments be solved?
- How could God help people to get on better with each other?

TASK

What can you do when you next see people having an argument? What would you look like? What would you sound like? How would helping solve an argument make you feel?
